Library Book Discussion Group Chooses ‘Fools Crow,’ by James Welch

Rapid City, SD – November 5, 2008 -- November is ‘Native American Heritage Month @ the Library,’ with programs, events, exhibits and displays with a Native American theme all month long. In keeping with this, the library’s ‘Sunday Selections’ book discussion group will discuss the novel Fools Crow by Native American author James Welch on **Sunday, November 16 from 2:00-4:00 p.m.** at the downtown library (610 Quincy Street). Welch is a well-known Native American author. He is of Blackfeet ancestry and his novels are set in or around reservation life in Montana. ‘Fools Crow’ is his third novel and won the Los Angeles Times Award for Fiction for 1986.

‘Sunday Selections’ is open to the public – no membership or advance reservation is required. The discussion of ‘Fools Crow’ will be led by Ruth Brennan.
